

# INDEPENDENT AUDITORS REPORT ON STATEMENT OF NET CAPITAL BALANCE

# To the Chief Executive Officer of Fair Trade Capital Securities (Private) Limited

#### Opinion

We have audited the Statement of Net Capital Balance of Fair Trade Capital Securities (Private) Limited (the "Securities Broker") and notes to the Statement of Net Capital Balance as at June 30, 2019 (hereinafter collectively referred to as "the statement").

#### **Basis for Opinion**

Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the statement section of our report. We are independent of the Securities Broker in accordance with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the statement in Pakistan, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

## Emphasis of Matter - Basis of Accounting and Restriction on Distribution

The statement is prepared to assist the Securities Broker to meet the requirements of the SECP, Pakistan Stock Exchange ("PSX") and National Clearing Company of Pakistan Limited ("NCCPL"). As a result, the statement may not be suitable for any other purpose. Our report is intended solely for the Securities Broker, SECP, PSX and NCCPL, and should not be distributed to parties other than the Securities Broker, SECP, PSX or NCCPL. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

### Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the statement

Management is responsible for the preparation of the statement in accordance with the Regulations and SEC Rules 1971, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of the statement that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud of error.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the Securities Broker's financial reporting process.
